- 2. Ma'an Tourist Trail: "Ma'an Historical and Heritage Museum Restoration of Ma'an city center / the old heritage market Ma'an Shamiyah Gardens Roman Bath Pool" (Development of the heritage market)
- 3. Ma'an Trail: Shobak Castle Montreal Hotel Al-Jaya Village Adhruh Visitors Center Mount Arbitration leading to Ma'an the old market Ma'an Shamiyah Gardens Ma'an Museum King Abdullah Distinguished King Abdullah I Palace.
- 4. Palm Valley trail, from the beginning to the end.
- 5. Trail from Qa'a Al-Jafr to the north ending at the Shomari Reserve in Azraq (Desert Trail). It is worth noting that this trail is commonly known as the Clubb Pasha Road or Abu Hunaik Road. This trail features four-letter symbols indicating the directions of the road.
